**JURUPA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT
TO HOST THE 2018 “WATER IS LIFE” STUDENT ART CALENDAR AND EXHIBIT**

JURUPA VALLEY, CA (January 12, 2018) – Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) will host the 2018 “Water is Life” Student Art Calendar and Exhibit Tour from January 16-23, 2018. Half of the exhibit will be on display at JCSD’s headquarters located at 11201 Harrel Street, in Jurupa Valley, CA. and the other half will be on display at the Eastvale Community Center (ECC) located at 13820 Schleisman Road, Eastvale, CA.

The 2018 Student Art Exhibit Tour showcases student artwork with imaginative messages of water conservation and stewardship. Students in grades K-12 submit artwork through participating local agencies to Metropolitan Water District (MWD) of Southern California’s “Water is Life” Calendar contest. A final selection of 36 art pieces is featured in the annual “Water is Life” Student Art Calendar with an annual distribution of 11,000 recipients. The Student Art Exhibit Tour displays student art and conservation messages to over 20,000 viewers throughout MWD’s six county service area over the course of 26 weeks.

The “Water is Life” poster contest encourages students to create artwork that celebrates the importance of water in our lives. JCSD has participated in the poster contest for 5 years. Last year over 400 posters were submitted to JCSD, 4 of which moved on to MWD’s “Water is Life” Student Art Calendar contest. One of JCSD’s submissions, by artist Mariah Rosario from Eleanor Roosevelt High School in Eastvale CA is included in the
