Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) 2019 Annual Water Quality Report

Jurupa Valley, CA (June 30, 2020) – JCSD is pleased to announce the release of its 2019 Annual Water Quality Report (Report). The Report is required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB).

"Safe and reliable drinking water remains one of JCSD's top priorities," said JCSD General Manager Chris Berch. "JCSD tap water is carefully monitored from the source to the tap- 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The JCSD team is committed to providing this essential service."

The SWRCB requires water agencies to provide all customers with an annual report on the quality of their drinking water and to show how it meets federal and state drinking water standards. JCSD continues to meet or exceed all stringent drinking water quality standards set by the EPA and SWRCB.

This year, in an effort to reach as many customers as possible, JCSD is providing two ways for residents to view the Report:

- A hard copy will be mailed to each account

"Open and transparent reporting is important to our community. To ensure that all of our residents are informed about their tap water, the Report is available online in both English and Spanish and may be translated into Chinese, Vietnamese, Korean, and Tagalog, if requested," said Berch.
